THE 2011 TOLEDO PUBLIC LIBRARY SUMMER READING PROGRAM

Each year, the Toledo Public Library sponsors a Summer Reading Program. The intent of the program is to keep young people reading through the summer months. As in the past, the Summer Reading Program has a theme: “One World, Many Stories.” Toward that end we suggest books on travel-related themes as good books to read.

This is how it works:

[1] Sign-up for the program begins the final week of the school year. To sign up, come into the Library and fill out a registration sheet—that’s all there is to it!

[2] Read the books you wish to read—but read at your grade level. If the young person cannot yet read, a parent may read to the child and each book read can be counted.

[3] An individual who reads 10 books at his or her grade level during the summer will receive a Summer Reading Program T-Shirt after the final Thursday Event. [The program ends the day school begins.]
