#### 19 4. **DISCUSSION**

#### Can the City afford to pay Council members a stipend 20

21 Mayor Cross indicated he wanted to add this topic for discussion to consider whether the City should implement a stipend for Council members. He noted several other cities within the state 22 23 offer stipends and said for example, the City of Halsey provides a stipend of \$300 per month to 24 Council members and \$400 to the Mayor. He said the topic has been discussed at the League of 25 Oregon Cities' meetings recently. The Council debated whether a stipend would improve volunteerism for Council vacancies. It was noted the stipend would be a taxable income and one 26 27 Councilor suggested there be an option to opt out of receiving the stipend if it were available. After 28 further discussion, the Council asked for the topic to be brought back at a future meeting for more 29 consideration.

#### 31 5. DECISION ITEMS

#### Approve purchase of new vehicle for Public Works and surplus of trade in vehicle 32

33 CM Richter said this item was held over from the last meeting after Council requested more 34 information. She referenced the packet, which included information comparing an F150 with an 35 F250. The Council inquired why the vehicle order was made before it came before the Council. CM Richter indicated it was her understanding former Public Works Director Bill Zuspan placed 36

- 37 the order because of the long wait time for vehicles and stated she is not certain of the details.
- 38 Councilor Mix referred to a handout she passed out before the meeting comparing a F150 to a
- 39 F250 because it was not addressed in the packet materials. She expressed concern in regards to the 40
- vehicle order being placed before the request to Council because anything beyond the City 41 Manager's authority must go before Council as a policy.

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- 1 There was discussion in regards to when the vehicle would be delivered and Council members
- 2 commented on whether the grounds vehicle would be needed for heavier tasks in the winter and
- 3 appreciated the packet comparison.

5 Motion – It was moved and seconded (Kamikawa/Kauffman) Motion to approve purchase of 2023 6 Ford F150 SuperCab Pickup Truck and approve the surplus of a 2006 Ford F250 as a trade in 7 vehicle and the motion carried four to one with Council Mix opposed.

#### 9 Permit application, consideration to extend alcohol services to outdoor seating area; Elks Lodge

## 10

11 CR Figueroa provided the council report and referenced the Council packet. She noted staff 12 including Contract Planner Justin Peterson met with Barry Bruster of the Elks Lodge to clarify 13 what was included in their request. She noted they want to extend their services to an outside patio. 14 She commented there is currently no policy in the City in regards to a business requesting to 15 expand services to serve alcohol and staff preferred to bring it to the Council for review. The 16 Council reviewed the request, there was discussion about whether the services would impact the 17 neighboring residences such and it was noted the Council could impose any conditions they feel 18 would apply. 19

- 20 Motion – It was moved and seconded (Mix/Kauffman) to approve the permit application to extend
- 21 alcohol services for an outdoor seating for the Elks Lodge so long as they include an appropriate 22 egress, and consideration for the neighbors such as noise and lights and the motion carried 23 unanimously.

#### 25 Approve a Contract with C-More Pipe Services for \$43,000

- 26 CM Richter summarized the council report and indicated this is another project related to the 27 inflow and infiltration mitigation. She said the contractor is ready to proceed with Council 28 approval.

- Motion It was moved and seconded (Kamikawa/Bush) to approve a contract with C-More Pipe 30 31 Services for \$43,000 and authorizing the City manager to sign the contract.

#### 33 6. REPORTS AND COMMENTS

- PC said the County was offering to the cities a class for a Medical Death Investigation certification 34 and he said two employees were interested and will attend that class. 35
- 36
- 37 CA Adams said he will work on a draft Livability Code for the Council to review in a future 38 meeting.
- 39
- 40 CM Richter thanked the Council and said she enjoyed serving as City Manager for the last three 41 years.
- 42
- 43 Councilor Mix commented about postings she has seen on social media regarding accessibility to
- 44 the Police Department and she said she invited them to the Council meeting. She said she would
- 45 really like to see more people volunteer in the City because she said she has learned a lot in her
- 46 time serving the City.
- 47
- 48 CP Kamikawa said Cascades West Area Commission on Transportation cancelled their meeting
- 49 this month but they are proceeding with planning for future improvements to Highway 101.

1 Mayor Cross commented on how citizens can assist to make change in the community. He 2 provided an example from several years ago when residents of a Toledo neighborhood would 3 record video outside their homes and they would provide video to the Police Department when 4 crimes were committed in their neighborhood and they were able to reduce the crimes that occurred 5 in that area. He said he was in Salem recently discussing the tools needed to be able to build on 6 the Coast. He said Chalk the Block happened over the weekend and some of the panels were 7 amazing.

#### **Background:**

There are two Planning Commission seats whose terms will expire at the end of 2023. One seat has been vacant for several months following the resignation of former member Terri Neimann.

A recruitment for the vacant and expiring terms was available. The information about the vacancies was posted on the City website as well as the monthly newsletter and two applications were received. One was from Ms. Morris, an incumbent, who expressed interest in serving on the Planning Commission for another term. The second application is from Mr. Sutherland, who lives outside of the City limits. Per Toledo Municipal Code; Title 2, Chapter 2.04(.010), "...The commission shall consist of seven members appointed by the mayor of Toledo and of which not more than two members shall be nonresidents of the city of Toledo." One of the open seats is available for a non-resident of Toledo. Both applications are attached.

The applicants were invited to this meeting for interviews. Interviewing the incumbent would be at the discretion of the Council and a copy of the interview questions is attached. The interviews are scheduled at the beginning of the meeting with a decision later on the agenda under decision items.

The Council may vote to appoint one or both individuals to the Planning Commission for terms. Staff makes no recommendations, but motions are included for reference.

#### **Recommendation:**

Motion to approve Resolution No. 1537, a resolution of the Toledo City Council authorizing the City to participate in a pfas class action litigation.

#### Background:

The Toledo Water Department is a member of a class of claimants in class action lawsuits filed against the manufacturers of certain firefighting foams containing PFAS, otherwise known as "forever chemicals." The lawsuits claim that PFAS manufactured by these defendants contaminated public drinking water sources.

Two of the defendants – 3M Company and DuPont de Nemours, Inc. – have agreed to settle the claims filed against them in these lawsuits in return for payments to impacted water systems. The settlement terms require the City to decide whether to participate in or opt out of the settlement. A decision to participate in the settlements qualifies the City for payments to offset the costs of remediating its impacted drinking water sources, but in return will release certain future claims against 3M and DuPont.

A decision to opt out of the litigation preserves potential claims the City might have in the future against those two defendants, but will disqualify the City from settlement payments. According to feedback provided on the Oregon City Attorney Association listserv, the City of Portland is the only City opting out, to preserve their ability to bring their own lawsuit against defendants.

After conferring with the City Attorney and Utilities staff to evaluate the pros and cons of participating in the settlements in executive session, staff recommends the City participate in the 3M and DuPont settlements in the In re: Aqueous Film-Forming Foams Product Liability Litigation currently consolidated in South Carolina federal court. Staff also seeks direction from Council to take steps necessary to participate in the settlement and claims process, including but not limited to preserving the City's rights in the claims administration process.

#### CITY OF TOLEDO RESOLUTION NO. 1537

#### A RESOLUTION OF THE TOLEDO CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO PARTICIPATE IN A PFAS CLASS ACTION LITIGATION

**WHEREAS,** The Toledo Water Department is a member of a class of claimants in nation-wide class action lawsuits filed against the manufacturers of certain firefighting foams containing Polyfluoroalkyl substance (PFAS), otherwise known as "forever chemicals." The lawsuits claim that PFAS manufactured by these defendants contaminated public drinking water sources; and

**WHEREAS,** two of the defendants – 3M Company and DuPont de Nemours, Inc. – have agreed to settle the claims filed against them in these lawsuits in return for payments to impacted water systems. The settlement terms require the City to decide whether to participate in or opt out of the settlement. A decision to participate in the settlements qualifies the City for payments to offset the costs of remediating its impacted drinking water sources, but in return will release certain future claims against 3M and DuPont; and

**WHEREAS**, a decision to opt out of the litigation will preserve potential claims the City might have in the future against those two defendants, but will disqualify the City for settlement payments; and

WHEREAS, after conferring with the City Attorney's Office and Utilities staff and evaluating the pros and cons of participating in the settlements in executive session, the City has decided to participate in the 3M and DuPont settlements in the In re: Aqueous Film-Forming Foams Product Liability Litigation currently consolidated in South Carolina federal court and direct and authorize staff to take steps necessary to participate in the settlement and claims process, including but not limited to preserving the City's rights in the claims administration process.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF TOLEDO RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1.	The Council authorizes staff to contact Eurofins or other laboratory accredited or certified by a state government or federal regulatory agency for PFAS analysis that uses any state or federal agency-approved or -validated PFAS analytical method that is consistent with (or stricter) than the requirements of UCMR-5; and
Section 2.	The Council authorizes staff to enter into a contract to test the City's two water sources; and
Section 3.	The Council directs staff to submit or cause the testing laboratory to submit detailed PFAS test results to the Claims Administrator on a Claims Form within forty-five (45) calendar days after receiving the test results, absent what the Claims Administrator deems in writing to be an extraordinary circumstance, and no later than July 1, 2026.
Section 4.	The Council directs City of Toledo staff to complete the Phase 2 claims forms, found on online at the Settlement website, and submit them to the Claims Administrator

electronically or on paper without further action of the City Council; and

Section 5. That this Resolution shall be effective immediately upon passage by the Toledo City Council.

#### **Recommendation:**

Motion to approve a construction contract with Richards Remodeling for Phase 1 of the Public Safety Building Remodel not to exceed \$1,009,300 and authorizing the City Manager to sign the contract.

#### Background:

As with the notice of intent to award the original bid on the project was for \$1.288 million. Council allowed the City Manager to negotiate with Richards Remodeling to come within a manageable budget for the project. After negotiations and some small changes in the scope, management was able to arrive at a number manageable to its budget. There are still a few additional areas to save with Public Works' ability to do some of the demolition work gaining some additional savings. This bid will provide the public safety building with new siding, windows, a few seismic upgrades and new roof. The Finance Department will be bringing forward a couple budget adjustments to allot for this budgeted amount at a later time.

# THIS CONTRACT, made between the **CITY OF TOLEDO**, an Oregon Municipal Corporation, hereinafter called "Owner," and **RICHARDS REMODELING L.L.C.**, hereinafter called "Contractor".

#### TERMS:

The Contractor, in consideration of the sums to be paid and other covenants herein contained, agrees to perform and complete the work herein described and to furnish all necessary machinery, tools, apparatus, equipment, supplies, materials, and labor and perform all work on the **Toledo Public Safety Building Roofing and Siding Replacement Project** in accordance with the Project Plans; Specifications Manual, Divisions 01-09, Toledo Public Safety Facility, prepared by Scott Edwards Architecture; and Structural Calculations, prepared by Engineer Douglas E. Paola, and in accordance with such alterations or modifications of the same as may be made by the City, and according to such directions as may from time to time be made or given by the City under the authority and within the meaning and purpose of this Contract. This agreement shall be binding upon the heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns of the Contractor.

Compensation. As consideration for the performance of all terms and conditions set forth in this Contract, City promises to pay the total sum of total compensation, including reimbursement for expenses incurred, upon receipt of a statement to be submitted by Contractor, which shall not exceed One Million Nine Thousand and Three Hundred Dollars (\$1,009,300), except the City agrees to additionally pay Contractor, by Unit or Cost Per Square Foot, for demolition and replacement of an unknown amount of *Wall Sheeting* and *Roof Sheeting*, not apparent and yet to be discovered, due to previous water damage, in the amounts immediately below:

Unit or Cost Per Square Foot for demolition and replacement of an unknown amount of <i>Wall Sheeting</i> due to previous water damage:	<u>\$109 per unit</u>
Unit or Cost Per Square Foot for demolition and replacement of an unknown amount of <i>Roof Sheeting</i> due to previous water damage:	<u>\$124 per unit</u>

The RPF, applicable Drawings, the Project Plans; Specifications Manual, Divisions 01-09, Toledo Public Safety Facility, prepared by Scott Edwards Architecture; and Structural Calculations, prepared by Engineer Douglas E. Paola, the payment, performance and bid bonds submissions, the bid, executed by Christopher Vejnoska and John Vejnoska, and notarized on October 23, 2023, as amended by the Value Engineering Proposal, dated December 26, 2023 (collectively called the "Contract Documents"), are hereby specifically referred to and by reference made a part hereof, and shall by such reference have the same force and effect as though all of the same were fully inserted herein.

The Contractor shall faithfully complete and perform all of the obligations of this Contract, and in particular, shall promptly, as due, make payment of all just debts and obligations incurred in the performance of said Contract and shall not permit any lien or claim to be filed or prosecuted against the City. The Contractor agrees to perform work according to the highest industry standards for their profession.

The Contractor, its subcontractors, if any, and all employers working under this Contract are subject employers under the Oregon Workers' Compensation Law and shall comply with ORS 656.017, which requires them to provide workers' compensation coverage for all their subject workers.

The Contractor agrees to protect, indemnify, and hold harmless the Owner, its officers, agents, and employees harmless against any and all loss, claims, or suits (including costs and attorney's fees) for or on account of injury to or death of persons, damage to, or destruction of property belonging to either the Owner or others occurring by reason of the act or neglect of the Contractor, Contractor's employees, or agents (including subcontractors) in connection with the performance of this Contract.

It is expressly understood that this Contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of Oregon. The statutes of the State of Oregon for public improvement contracts, specifically but not exclusively ORS 279C, as amended or

superseded, including the latest additions and revisions, are incorporated by reference as part of the Contract Documents, and the party contracting with the Owner hereby covenants and agrees to comply with all of the obligations and conditions applicable to public contracts pursuant to ORS 279C as though each obligation or condition were set forth fully herein. In addition, if the contract identified above calls for a public improvement as that term is defined by ORS 279A.010, the party contracting with the Owner further agrees to comply with all obligations and conditions applicable to public contracts for public improvements pursuant to ORS 279C as though each obligation each obligation or conditions applicable to public contracts for public improvements pursuant to ORS 279C as though each obligation or condition were set forth fully herein.

The Contractor agrees that the SPECIAL PROVISIONS I–STANDARD TERMS, and SPECIAL PROVISIONS II– OREGON PUBLIC CONTRACTING PROVISIONS, attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein, are hereby specifically referred to and by reference made a part hereof, and shall by such reference have the same force and effect as though all of the same were fully inserted herein.

The Contractor further declares by the signing of this Contract that all the provisions required by ORS 279A to 279C relating to Public Contracts, Purchasing, and Prevailing Wage Rates for work performed under the Contract with the Owner are made part of this Contract as completely as if the same were fully set forth herein.






