# H20-Royam

The City of Toledo asks for your help participating in a donation program to support individuals and families in need of assistance paying their water bill. Donations will be used to provide assistance for those who are experiencing financial difficulties.

Donations can be made a number of ways:

- 1. Customers can write in a donation amount on the return slip of their billing when making their monthly payment.
- 2. One time donations can be made.
- 3. Customers choosing to provide a continuing donation can contact City Hall and have that billed on their water bill. The amount will then be included with their regular monthly utility billing.

\*The donation amount can be changed or stopped at any time by written request to the Utility Billing Office.

All funds collected are turned over to a local social services organization to administer on behalf of the City. The program is designed to help make up the difference between what a customer can pay and what they owe.

Donations may qualify for a tax deduction; however donors should consult their tax preparer or lawyer to be sure.

#### PUBLIC WORKS CORNER

The public works crew has been busy this past year working on many projects. There will be no shortage of them in the years to come, either. To recap 2023, public works has improved many of its manholes and lined many sewer lines throughout town. While we only got about half of what we would like to have completed, it is still a substantial haul. This is great news as we try and knock down the I&I to our sewer system. Additionally we completed paving a couple streets early in 2023 on the NE side of town. We have begun project planning on a portion of Fir Street between 7th Street and 10th Street. We hope this project to be completed by March of 2024. Phase 2 of the Mill Creek replacement was completed. This was a daunting task, but even with the weather, it was completed in about three weeks. Of course, we also have been upgrading the bathrooms at Arcadia Park and placed a new fence around the tennis courts. They should get so close to finishing up the bathrooms by the end of 2023, as we are awaiting electric and plumbing services to finish up. At the water department we have near completion of back up generation at the water plant and expect it to come online in early 2024. Lastly we have bid the first phase of the Public Safety Building to begin siding, roofing and



seismic upgrades. All of these projects are sizable and are completed while servicing our citizens. I do thank you for your time and patience as we have experienced change this past year with a new Financial Director, City Manager and Public Works Director. May 2024 be even brighter for the City of Toledo.

## **TOLEDO PUBLIC SAFETY**

Tis' the season of hustle and bustle. Toledo Public Safety officials want to remind you to slow down and be safe. Just over the last few weeks of November Toledo Fire and Rescue have responded to an uptick in vehicle crashes. Some of these crashes have been very serious and have required some of the specialties we train. While all crashes are serious, no



matter how big or small, much of the common



thread is to SLOW DOWN. When the roads are wet, especially this time of year, black ice can form. Believe it or not, black ice can form even when temperatures are above freezing. The City of Toledo and our fire rescue personnel want your holiday season to be a time of joy and not tragedy, please watch road conditions and watch your speed. Give yourself some extra time!



### **TOLEDO PLANNING DEPARTMENT**

The Toledo Planning Committee has been very active this past year updating the Toledo Comprehensive plan. This document is the guiding planning document for Toledo for the next 20 years. It addresses changes in population, housing, economic viability, parks, transportation, and zoning to name a few. In November, the planning commission passed its finalized version of the document to the Council for review and adoption. This hearing will be taking place on December 6, 2023 at the City Council meeting. Please contact City Hall for a copy or to have one emailed to you. Public input on this document is so important.
