- ✓ lethargy
- ✓ lack of coordination
- ✓ vomiting
- ✓ diarrhea

- Record information about the vehicle (make, model, color, and license plate number)
- Alert the management of the business
- Call the police or animal control
- Stay with the dog until help arrives

Homeowners/tenants are responsible for providing regular maintenance of a property's exterior and landscaping. Yards and alleys should be maintained continually to prevent them from becoming unsightly or a fire hazard, or from maturing or going to seed.

WARM WEATHER IS COMING SOON!

As we approach the hot summer days of 2023, residents are asked to begin taking the following voluntary actions to curtail water use, before we have to restrict:

- * Cease washing vehicles, except at commercial facility
- * Don't wash outdoor surfaces;
- * Cease filling swimming pools (some exceptions)
- * Cease using water to maintain water features, except those supporting fish life;
- * Reduce indoor water use by fixing any indoor leaks, as soon as possible;
- * Reduce non-essential water use in commercial/industrial establishments;
- * Restrict watering lawns, landscaping, vegetable gardens to 3 days/week, 9 pm-9 am
- * Do not allow water to run to waste in any gutter or drain

Public Works crews have been running hard to keep up with all the mowing and spring-time maintenance. Parks are in great shape and the Memorial Field parking lot has fresh asphalt chips to help hold down dust. The summer flower baskets are hung along Main Street and Business Hwy. 20. Electrical power has been added to areas on Main Street to accommodate vendors at the larger events, and banners are in place at the highway junctions for summer activities. Our visitors will be here soon!

We have broken ground for the Arcadia Park restrooms and cement has been poured. New mural locations on Main Street have been chosen, and artists are working on projects, as we speak. New bike racks were installed at bus stops, JC Market, and Toledo Library.

City crews are painting all of the stop bars, crosswalks, parking places, railroad crossings, and both red and yellow curbs. A contractor will complete the striping of the center and fog lines on all City streets in July.
